EUROPEAN AUDIOVISUAL AUTHORS' CONTRACTS GUIDELINES

In every country, the following items and clauses must be clearly set out in any audiovisual author's contract.

A general distinction needs to be maintained between clauses applicable to the **Work** (salary, terms, conditions, etc) and those concerning the **Assignment of Rights** (fees for use, term of assignment, etc). In some territories (e.g. France), there are separate contracts for each.

A general distinction needs to be made between **initial payments**, usually connected to the undertaking of the necessary work (for director sometimes as salary or self-employed), and **later payments**, more usually connected to distribution of the finished work and sometimes managed by Collective Rights Management.

Each section refers to a corresponding **Database Contract Term***, which will allow for individuals to find existing contract clauses in use in a wide range of European countries.

Some of these clauses will be improved by the **2019 Directive on Copyright in the Digital Single Market** through the indicated provisions, which can already inspire contract negotiation prior to the completion of the implementation process.

DIRECTIVE EU 2019/790 PROVISIONS

\triangleright Transparency obligation (article 19)

- In scope for reporting : all modes of exploitation (national and worldwide, including merchandising), all revenues generated and remuneration due
- Up to date, relevant and comprehensive information once a year from contractual partner
- Possibility for joint request to sub-licensee for additional information
- Referring to collective agreement defining sector-specific aspects of the transparency obligation in practice

All rights used must be paid for. Methods of payment, e.g. whether direct to the Screenwriter/Director, or via a collective management organisation or agent, must be stated, along with arrangements for access to distribution accounts or sales figures to verify the Screenwriter/Director's share. 8

- Creative rights define the rights of the Screenwriter/Director to a final say in respect of their creative work on the project and need to be precisely defined.
- Moral Rights legally belong to the Screenwriter/Director as a private person and cannot be transferred.

Option agreements give a producer an exclusive option to acquire rights in a project for a contractually defined period and usually summarise the main intended contractual terms which are intended to apply if the optioner exercises their option.

Every contract must be signed and dated, with witnesses, by Producer/Employer and Screenwriter / Director.

CONTRACT **NEGOTIATION** CHECKLIST

Optional short letter summarizing the main contractual terms agreed by Producer/Employer and Screenwriter/Director which includes key budget information (top sheet) allowing for the Director to safely commence work. It can be useful in cases where lawyers or agents may take a long time finalising the full contract. The Contract, once signed, immediately replaces the Deal Memo.
